Guillaume Serina is a French-American journalist and five time published author. He teaches history and political science at the International School of Los Angeles. Born and raised in Paris, he has been living in Los Angeles since 2006. Serina attended the Sorbonne University in Paris, where he received his Master's degree in History of International Relations with a specialization in American History and the U.S. political system. A journalist for more than twenty years, collaborating with international media such as CNN, Le Parisien and Le Monde, he has published five nonfiction books, including ***An Impossible Dream. Reagan, Gorbachev and the World Without the Bomb***, with an introduction by Mikhail Gorbachev (Pegasus Books, 2019).
